Future ethical issues

Globalization, S&T, education, and general progress are accelerating the factors of change and introducing new elements in our ordinary human life. What are the ethical implications of these accelerating changes? What in the system of values that we are used to will change dramatically and what are the ethical issues of the future generation?

Over the past year, the Millennium Project of the American Council for the UNU conducted a study on emerging global ethical issues and principles by which such issues might be resolved in the future. The scope was global and the time-span up to 2050. The purpose of the study was to:

- identify important, novel ethical issues of global scale that might come on the scene within the next 50 years;
- assess the relative importance of these issues and the likelihood of their resolution;
- articulate the key principles that might be used in the solution of such ethical issues.

This presentation will share the results of the two-round Delphi on Future Ethical Issues.
