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System-exchange in higher education and lifelong learning

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Two standard models of the higher education have spread over the world: the dual or parallel education and the linear or serial model. The exchange of the two models is happening in Hungary at present, more precisely the dual system will be followed by the linear system that is based on the triple level of the Bachelor, Master and Doctoral education from the 2006/2007 academic year. The lecture is looking for answers for the challenges emerging in higher education during the system exchanging to the new, as it is called Bologna-system.

First of all, is it possible to establish a harmonic connection between the internationally standardized higher education and the principle of lifelong learning? Can the standardized higher education help the graduated students' chances of finding a job in the rather narrowing labour market? What kind of students' migration processes can be expected in the next years?

The author tries to give answer for the questions after surveying data, laying emphasis mainly on the European countries, above all on the member-states of the European Union.
